

RARE

At a time when live theatre is at a standstill, and video-conferencing programs have become part of our day-to-day, the ITP artistic family and I decided to try an experiment: could we possibly use the latter as a platform to create something resembling the excitement of the former? Rather than bemoaning our circumstances and adopting the "it isn't theatre if it isn't live" mentality, could we create something specifically for the virtual medium that embraced the limitations it presents and find artistically creative ways around them? While much of what's been released over the past several months has been adapted for the digital landscape, we're proud to present one of the first wholly original works written specifically for the virtual stage, with roles custom-fit to ITP's incredibly talented ensemble.

RELEVANT

Every time we hop online or turn on the television, there they are again... despicable men in high-ranking positions abusing their power, while dismissing the wellness and safety of those they claim to serve. THE SPIN, thank goodness, is not about those men, but rather the folks whose job it is to speak to the public on their behalf - the press agents, the spin doctors, the PR consultants, the high-level aides. With the most important election in modern history looming at our doorstep, and a campaign trail riddled with uncountable lies and misinformation, our play asks the question: When your job hinges on your ability to assign blame elsewhere, what, if anything, do you accept responsibility for? Do you swallow bile before lying for your client, or do you convince yourself that their truth is the truth? And for the rest of us, how do we fight the bad guys when they're convinced that they're actually the heroes of the story?

RAW

Human communication (and lack thereof) is rarely pretty, full of stops and starts and self-interruptions. But move that communication online, and you throw into the mix the time delays and technical hiccups that create a sort of clumsy cacophony that is nevertheless real. This play seeks to capture that. But equally as messy are our characters' morals. Women find themselves taking on the blame for bad men's behavior. Colleagues fight like family. And because of the pandemic, it all takes place over Zoom, where everyone always sits in close-up. THE SPIN is a fast, surprisingly funny, and completely unapologetic look at the world of Spin Doctors, the people who curate the news we digest daily, in hopes that we'll see things their way, whether it's true or not.

SPENSER DAVIS (Playwright/Director) is the Director of Programming for Broken Nose Theatre, an ensemble member at The Factory Theater, and the current Michael Maggio Directing Fellow at The Goodman. As a director, he's been nominated for the Jeff Award for Best Director three times, winning once. His credits include A Red Orchid Theatre, American Blues, The New Colony, Hell in a Handbag, Promethean Theatre, and First Floor Theater, among others.
